- Children may wear masks during lessons if you would prefer them to, providing they are able to refrain from fiddling with them and can keep them on. If you provide a mask for your child, please could you talk to them about the safe use of masks. They will also need a small bag or a tub to put their mask in whilst they are outside playing and having dinner.

# <u>Staffing</u>

<u>Staff absence</u> - We continue to have some staff illness and some staff currently shielding.
